Would you like to study creative writing and British literature at one of the UK's top universities? If so, the Centre for New Writing at The University of Manchester offers an academically rigorous four-week summer school, which is credit-bearing and has been specifically designed for international students.

Features include:

- A gala event featuring world-famous novelist Martin Amis
- Guided trips to literary sites in London, the Lake District and the Yorkshire Moors
- Readings and Q&A sessions with visiting novelists and poets
- Creative writing workshops led by published writers
- Lectures and seminars on a range of British literature
- The chance to explore vibrant Manchester – England's second city
- Accommodation and meals in centrally located University buildings

The summer school will offer the following courses:

Creative Writing - a workshop-based course in which students will have the opportunity to write, read and discuss short stories and poetry.

Locating Literary England - students will explore the roles and meanings of place in the work of writers such as Wordsworth, the Brontës, Dickens, Woolf, Ted Hughes and Martin Amis, through a mixture of lectures, seminars and field trips.

Each course will be worth 10 UK study credits. These usually equate to 3 US credits, however it is the prerogative of a student's home university to make the appropriate grade transfer - please consult your International Programs Office.

The summer school is open to undergraduates entering their Junior or Senior year, who have a GPA of 3.0 or above and an interest in literature and/or creative writing.

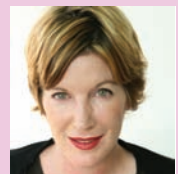


About the Centre for New Writing
